Code of Conduct

Everyone deserves to feel safe and welcome. This means being mindful of our language and behaviour, and zero tolerance for prejudice and discrimination. It means not making assumptions about identity, experiences, or pronouns.



No language that is racist, sexist, homophobic, transphobic, ablelist, or any other type of discriminatory language, will be tolerated.

We don't expect that everyone will always agree with each other, but discussions and debates must be conducted in a respectful manner, free from intimidation, insults or belittling.

We believe that inclusion must be an active process too: something you actively do, not just something you don't.

Making sure that all voices are heard requires respectfulness, active listening and being mindful that no-one is dominating a discussion. It means creating space for everyone to be heard in meetings if they want to be, and finding ways to make sure people feel included in other ways if they don't.
