About Levenshulme Old Library:

Levenshulme Old Library is a historic Carnegie library and community charity, serving as an arts and culture centre for the local community. Originally funded by philanthropist Andrew Carnegie, the library has been a cornerstone of the community since 1904. After a period of closure, it was revitalised and reopened in 2018 through the efforts of the Levenshulme Old Library, a charitable incorporated organisation, and the support of the local community.

Levenshulme Old Library is entering a transformative phase. We are on the brink of signing a 25-year lease through a community asset transfer, securing the building's future as a hub for arts, culture and community activities. This long-term lease will enable us to expand our programmes, enhance our facilities, and deepen our impact on the community. As we embark on this journey, we are looking for a visionary leader to guide us through this exciting period of growth and development.

As Chair, you will play a pivotal role in ensuring that Levenshulme Old Library continues to thrive as a vital community hub, helping to create opportunities for local residents and artists, and fostering a sense of belonging.

Role and Responsibilities:

- Provide leadership and direction to the Board of Trustees.
- Oversee strategic planning and governance to ensure alignment with the organisation's mission.
- Oversee business activities to ensure strategic alignment and compliance with legal and regulatory requirements.
- Ensure effective HR oversight and support for employees.
- Represent LOL to external stakeholders and build strong relationships within the community.
- Provide strategic direction and support for fundraising efforts and securing resources to support LOL's mission.
- Guide the organisation through its continued growth and development, with a focus on strategic planning and long-term sustainability.
- Collaborate closely with the Board and General Manager to cultivate a dynamic, inclusive leadership team that empowers staff and volunteers.

Qualifications:

- Previous experience in a similar leadership or governance role, with a preference for experience in community arts.
- Strong understanding of HR practices and employment law.
- Proven leadership skills with strategic thinking and problem-solving abilities.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- A commitment to the mission and values of Levenshulme Old Library.
- Ability to work collaboratively with a diverse group of stakeholders.

Commitment:

The Chair will be expected to prepare for and lead bi-monthly board meetings and participate in at least one sub-committee. Line management of the General Manager will include formal appraisals every six months and 1:1s as needed. With oversight of financial and HR responsibilities, we estimate the time commitment to be approximately 4-6 hours per month.
